

Instructions for Exhibitors at the

Danish Ophthalmological Society Annual Meeting (DOS) 4. – 6. marts, 2022.

Venue

Comwell Kolding, Skovbrynet 1, 6000 Kolding

Location of the Exhibition

The exhibition area is located at Comwell Kolding. Please see the enclosed floor plan of the exhibition. Coffee and lunch will be served in the exhibition areas during the congress breaks.

Exhibition opening hours

The exhibition is open during the congress as follows:

- Friday, March 4th, 2022 at 16.00 – 19.30 (4 pm – 7.30 pm)
- Saturday, March 5th, 2022 at 09.00 – 17.30 (9 am – 5.30 pm)
- Sunday, March 6th, 2022 at 08.30 – 12.00 (8.30 am – 12 am)

Stand set-up and dismantling

The exhibition area and the stands are open for set-up on Thursday the 3rd March from 18.00 (6 pm)

Kindly notice that the exhibition area should be ready and final installation completed latest by 16.00 (4 pm). The Scientific Program starts Friday at 16.00 (4 pm).

The exhibition dismantling time is Sunday the 6th March after the lunch at 12.00. (12.00 am)
The stand should be completely cleared by 18. (6 pm)

The exhibitor is responsible for the installation and dismantling of his own stand materials.

Parking

The exhibition will take place in the foyer area. During on- and off- loading, the vans can park at the entrance in front of the congress center.

IMPORTANT: Please remove the van/car immediately after loading. There are enough parking spaces behind the hotel. They are free.

Stand and rental of additional exhibition furniture and decorations

The general maximum building height in the foyer is 3 m.

The price of the stand includes floor space, a conference table, 1 conference chair, 1 extension cord and Wi-Fi.

Exhibitors are also free to bring additional decoration materials and booth furniture themselves.

Use of exhibition space

Approval must be obtained from Comwell Kolding in advance for the following:

The location of any object weighing more than 400 kg, structures, and fittings higher than 300 cm

No exhibits or publicity products may be mounted on the floor, walls, ceiling, or columns. The exhibitor will be liable for any damage caused by him to the building or the exhibition area.

Catering services

Comwell Kolding has exclusive catering rights. Exhibitors may not serve any products brought to the stand themselves apart from their own company's sweets or other similar products.

Transport and storage

All exhibition goods must pass through a door with dimensions: door width 240 cm. Comwell Kolding has limited space for storing incoming or outgoing exhibition goods or other materials.

In case material and goods are wished to be delivered before the event, dates and time must be negotiated with Comwell Kolding. The shipment must include the following information:

Goods may arrive at the hotel from Thursday, 3th March 2022.

Storage of exhibition packaging materials during the conference

You are responsible for your materials during the event. A smaller room will be reserved for storage of packaging materials. Notice that the room is only not that big and has to be shared for all exhibitors, which you may consider when planning your shipments.

Pick up of goods no later than Monday, March 7th, 2022, no later than 10.00 from the hotel

Please pack your materials and arrange pickup, remember to mark the material well with all the labels that need to be on the package to be picked up. Remember to tell the housemen when they can expect the carrier to pick the package up.

Security

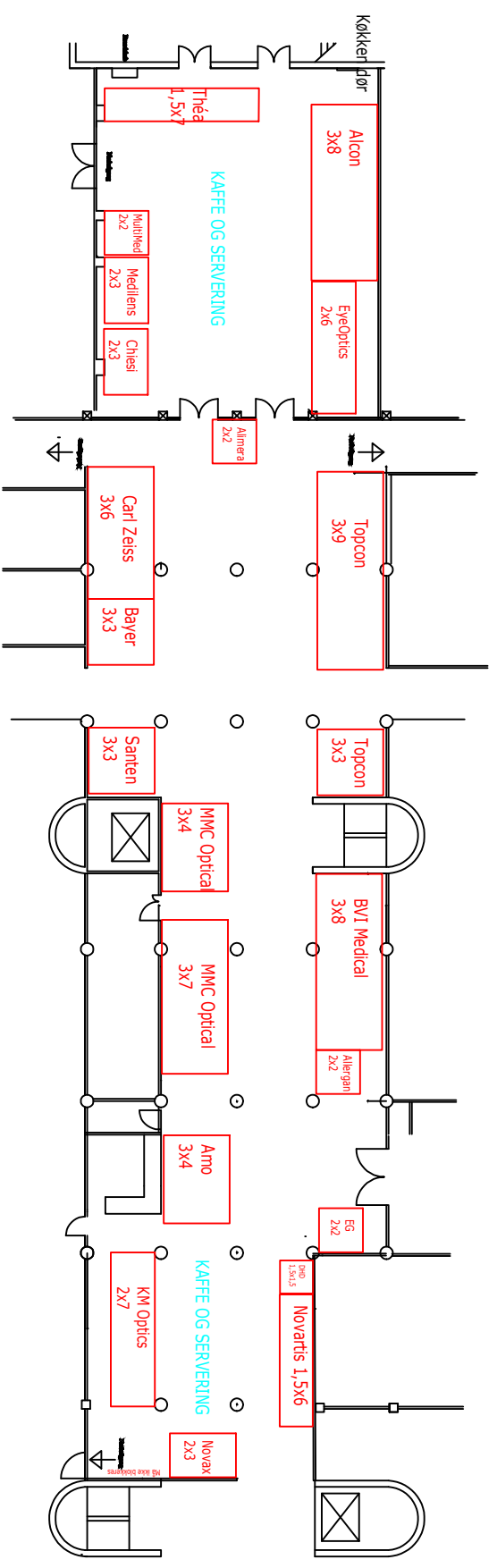
